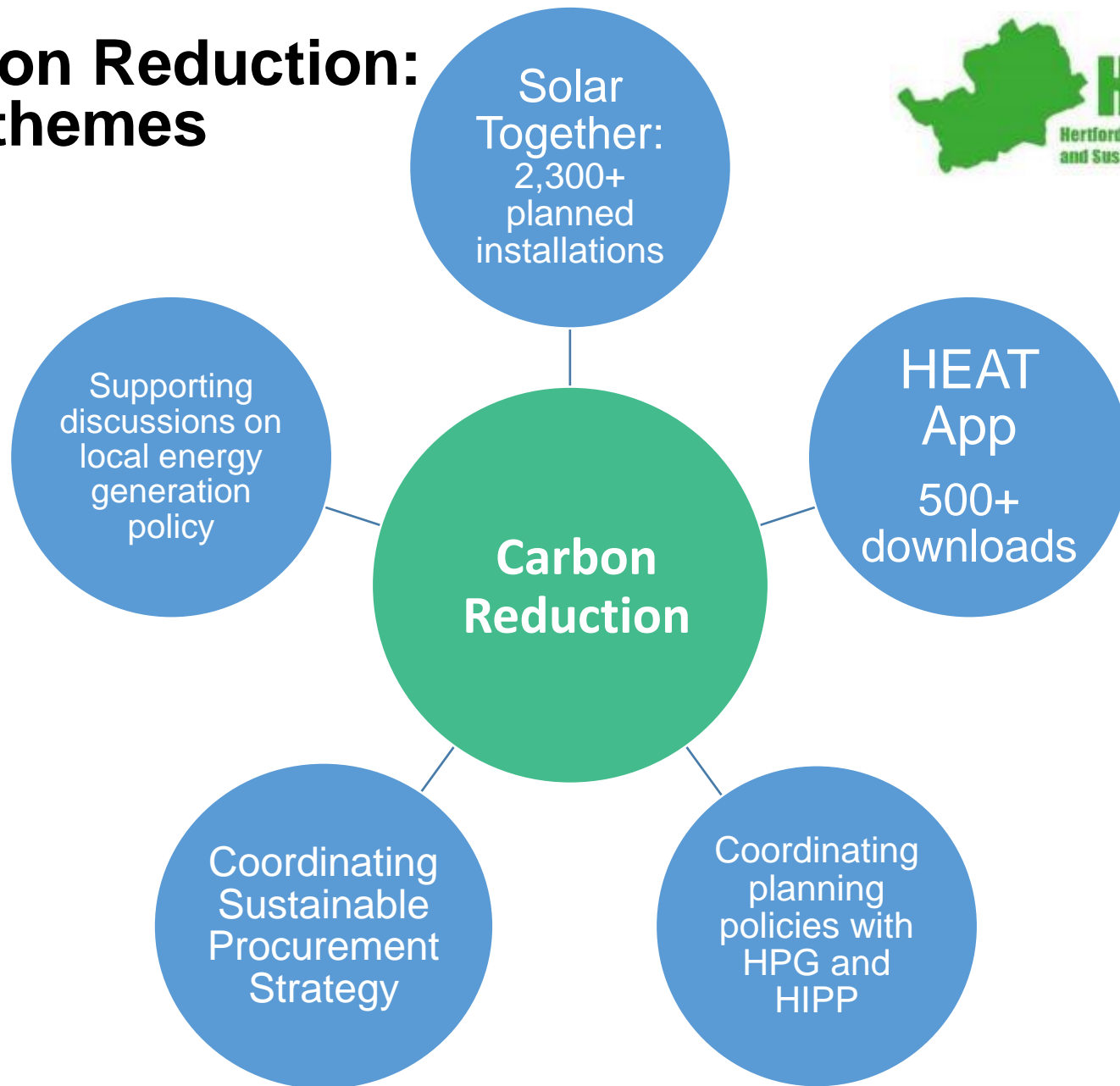

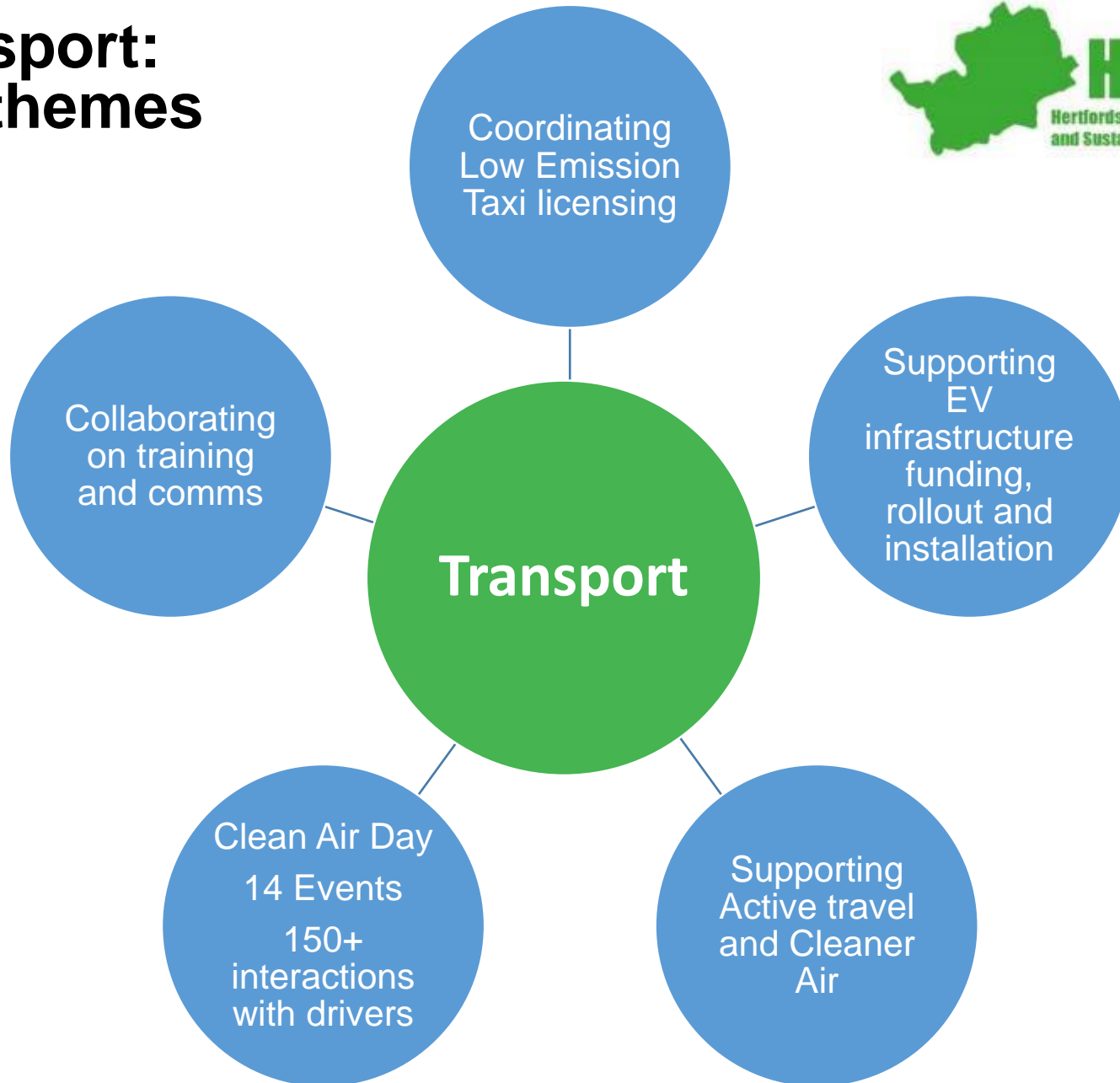

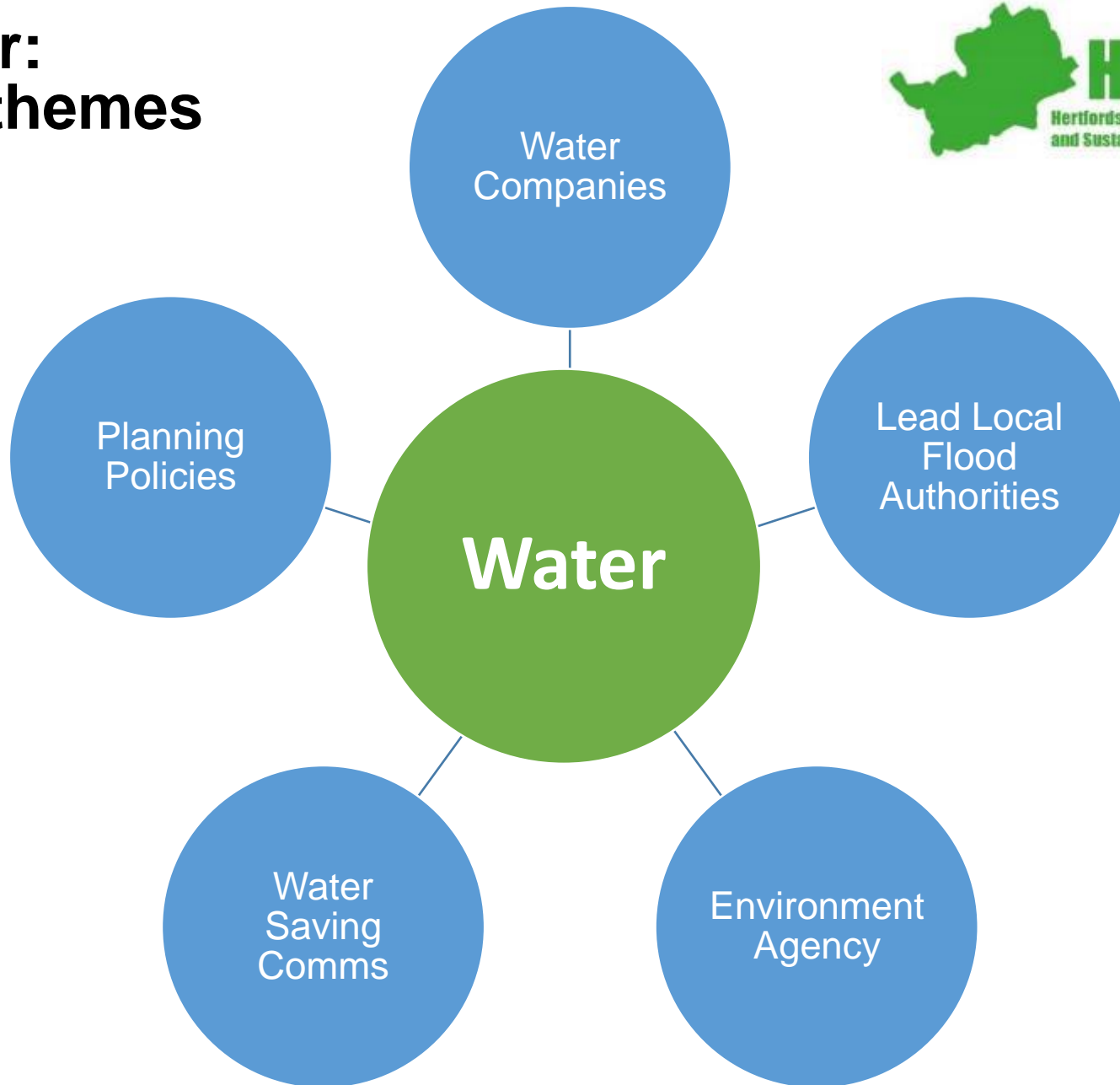
Carbon Reduction: Key themes



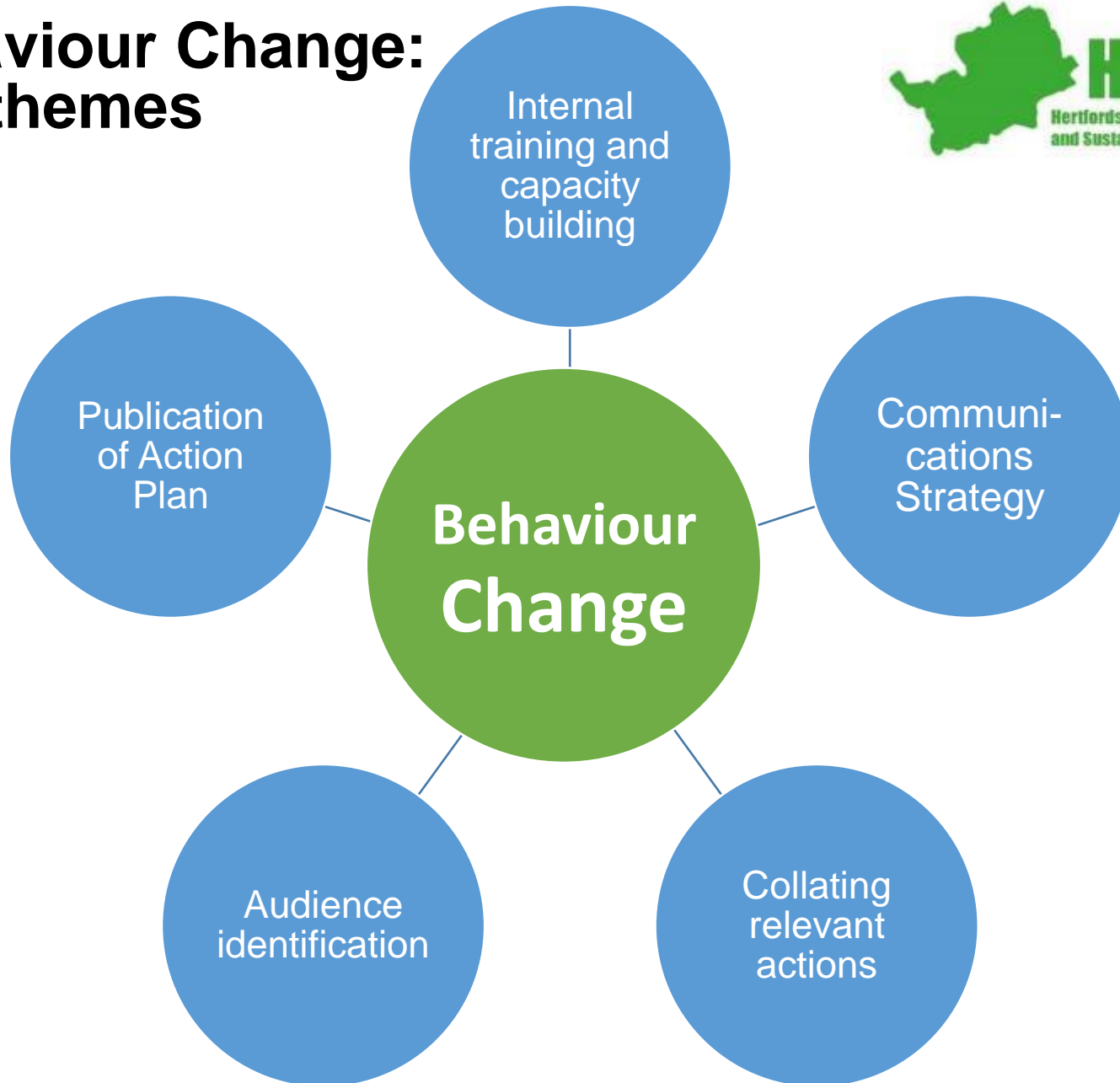

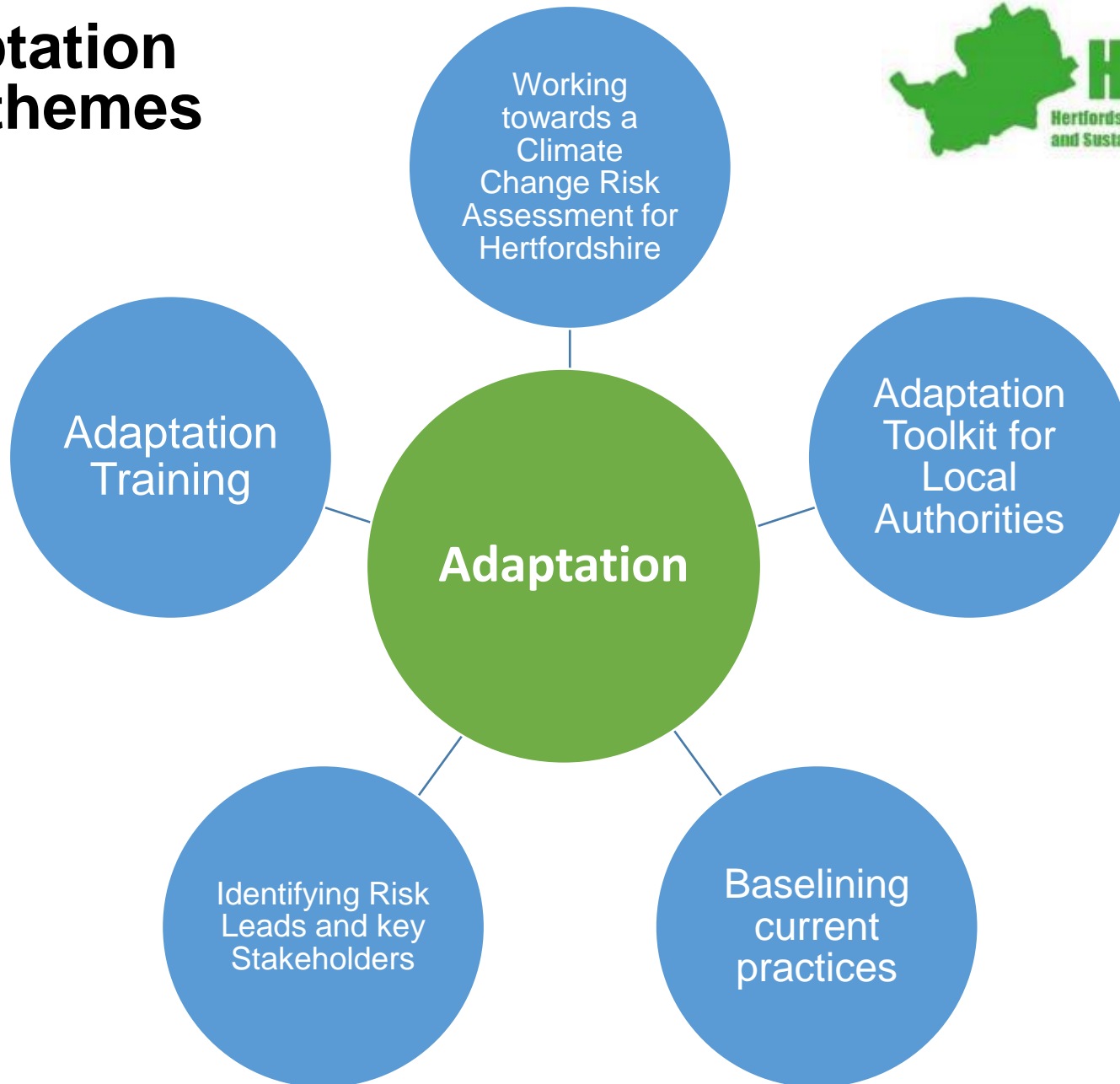

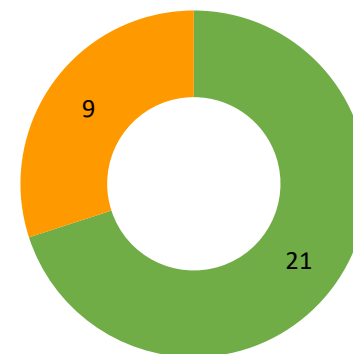
